Please take notice, that by order of the Board of Governors of Wildwood Shores Property Owner's Association the following amendment to Article V of the By-Laws of the said Association will be recommended to the membership at a meeting to be held at River Styx School, Hopatcong on June 15, 1957 at 2:00 P. M.

Delete the first paragraph, Article V, which reads:

"Active members shall annually on or before May 1st, pay \$10. per year for each unimproved lot owned by them and \$20. per year for each improved lot owned by them, it being understood that where a dwelling is erected on two or more lots, same to be considered as one improved lot and further that in case default is made in said payment and continues for thirty days, the amount so due shall become a lien on the premises which are the basis for said charge."

① Substitute as the first paragraph, Article V:

"Active members shall annually on or before May 1st, pay \$10.00 per year for each unimproved lot owned by them and \$30. per year for each improved lot owned by them, it being understood that where a dwelling is erected on two or more lots, same to be considered as one improved lot and further that in case default is made in said payment and continues for thirty days, the amount so due shall become a lien on the premises which are the basis for said charge."
