

Treasurer's Report as of November 1, 1965

This is the first report of the new treasurer since the books and files were turned over early in October. Those items given to the writer by Mr. Gulumerian are shown on "Receipt dated October 9, 1965", copy of which is a part of this report as an attachment. The original receipt was given to the outgoing treasurer Mr. Gulumerian. During the transfer it was pointed out that the auditor had indicated on the August 24, 1965 bank statement a discrepancy of \$100.00. No record of badges sold, that is list to whom sold, was available.

The present treasurer checked all of the "The Sussex & Merchants National Bank" statements together with cancelled checks and deposit receipts, and found them to be in order. There was not sufficient information available to check the statements from the "The Citizens National Bank of Netcong" for the period September 30, 1964 through November 30, 1964.

The items listed on the "Receipt dated October 9, 1965" which will be retained by the present treasurer are:

- item 1 - Check book on "The Sussex & Merchants National Bank" first blank check #155
- item 2 - Two pads of deposit slips
- item 10 - File on Hopatcong Boro Taxes
- item 15 - Deposit Stamp and Stamp Pad
- item 17 - Three page listing of collections by Mr. Gulumerian



item 19 - Two page list of expenses from December 12, 1964 through September 20, 1965

item 23 - One post binder with dues and payment records beginning April 1959

The remaining 16 items are of no value to the present Treasurer's operation and are being turned over to the President, Mr. Franchino with the suggestion that he appoint a committee to cull the files and place what is not destroyed in a file cabinet in the "Board Room".

The balance in the bank at the time of the transfer of records was 3,124.06. In addition checks for deposit were turned over to the new treasurer. These checks totalling 447.50 were:

Therefore the actual balance in bank or for deposit turned over to the new treasurer totalled 3,571.56.

Since the general meeting of September 4, 1965, letters phone calls and personal contacts have been made with delinquent members. At the time of

the general meeting in September there was a total of 34 (possibly 35) delinquent members owing the following:

Dues - 2067.00  
 Excise Taxes - 268.00  
 Cost of Lins - 29.60  
 Total - 2359.60

Since September 4, 1965 collections of dues taxes and cost of lins, represents more than 52% of the original outstanding amount. A substantial amount of the collections is represented by a credit to C Doran against property purchased by the association from him.

The collection and balance still due as of November 1, 1965 is:

Only one member replied indicating he would not pay and we have written him two additional letters. Of the remaining 13 letters nine favorable replies included 5 payments in full 4 paid in part with promises to pay up in full. Those who
