TO THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND
ALL MEMBERS OF THE WILDWOOD SHORES PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION:

The undersigned who took the initiative at the suggestion of several inhabitant friends of Hopatcong Borough, to distribute Petitions for signatures of all interested inhabitants, to convince the Mayor and Council of this Borough that the majority demand roadside House-to-House Mail Delivery as per pre-election pledges, and without further procrastination, has succeeded in securing to this moment 1323 signatures.

I have one of these Petition forms at this Association's Annual Meeting today, for any member interested to sign, if not previously done. All adult members of the family may sign separately.

At the next Mayor and Council meeting Thursday, September 5th, a committee composed of residents in different sections of the Borough, including myself, will be on hand to submit these Petitioners' signatures with advice that copies simultaneously are being sent to Congressman Frank Thompson, Jr. and the Regional Director of the Post Office Department in Philadelphia. At least, these should get some satisfactory action on the preparation and completion by Hopatcong's administration of the Tax Map which the Postal authorities require for eventual fulfillment of the roadside House-to-House Mail Delivery. About one-third of Hopatcong's inhabitants already receive such delivery via respectively the Andover and Stanhope Post Offices, rank discrimination.

So, anything any member can do to further increase our signature volume, or if members can see their way clear to join us at the next Council meeting on September 5th, the more the administration will be impressed.
