Your communication concerning the matter of the parking of your camper was read at a special meeting of Wildwood Property Owners' Association held July 15, 1972.

A discussion both pro and con regarding parking of campers, revealed that there was nothing in the present By-Laws forbidding such parking of non-commercial vehicles on private property. However, it was the overwhelming consensus of those present at the meeting, that consideration by you should be given to those who deem your camper both an eyesore and something that deflates values of property in the immediate area.

Those present at the meeting were reminded of a similar case in the past, when a large camper-trailer was parked within the Wildwood Shores tract. The action taken at that time was by members in the vicinity of the trailer. These members indicated to the owner of the trailer that in their opinion, the area was neither a campsite or a trailer park and that the camper marred the natural beauty of the area. The owner of the camper removed the vehicle the very next day and the harmony of the neighborhood was never placed in jeopardy.

We of the Board sincerely trust that you will understand that the reasons for objecting to your camper are not personal and that you will find in your heart the goodness to remove it and restore harmony in our community.
