Dear Members:

Enclosed is a copy of a letter we received recently from Mayor Lundin - it is self-explanatory. The issue of sewers in Hopatcong has generated mixed feelings from our residents for many years. Now, since the reality of sewers is a bit more tangible, the Board felt that our membership should have the opportunity to direct their questions and concerns to the Mayor.

You are all aware that the cost of replacing a septic system today is prohibitive, and yet installing sewers in our area is likely to be a costly project as well. Other factors that warrant consideration are the effect, if any, our septic systems have on the ecology of the lake or contamination of our well water. On the other hand, what impact, if any, will the blasting that will inevitably be required to install sewer mains have on our homes, property or the environment?

Mayor Lundin has agreed to meet with us at the Clubhouse at 10:00 AM on September 18 to discuss whatever concerns you may have. It is a topic of vital importance to all of us, and I urge you to be there. Remember, you are being given an opportunity to be heard - if you choose not to be there, then you are leaving the decision-making to someone else, and you will have to live with their decision.

On a different note, it was decided since most of our members will be around on the 18th, it might be a more appropriate evening to hold our COVERED DISH FAMILY SUPPER. It should be a memorable (and affordable) way to end what has been a particularly eventful summer season. Cost for the event is \$10.00 per family.
